Thus, the apostle's message is most clear:


Fellowship is proven by Obedience.



The Big Picture of Chapter Three! I. The <u>CHARACTERISTICS</u> of Fellowship!

A. (3:1-18) The Believer's Love is Proof of His/Her ABIDING Relationship with God.

B. (3:19-24) The Believer's Love is Returned through <u>ANSWERED</u> Prayer.



Chapters 2:28-3:18 III. The Characteristics of Fellowship!

- A. (2:28-3:3) True Fellowship is Characterized by PURITY!
 - 1. (vs.28-29) An OVERVIEW of John's teaching.
 - a. (v.28) The Plea for PURITY.
 - 1.) The <u>Plea</u>: Abide in the truth of Christ's Incarnation (1:7, 2:1-2, 12).
 - 2.) The <u>Point</u>: Abiding brings assurance and not shame (1:9, 2:1-2).

Chapters 2:28-3:18 III. The Characteristics of Fellowship!

- A. (2:28-3:3) True Fellowship is Characterized by PURITY!
 - 1. (vs.28-29) An OVERVIEW of John's teaching.
 - a. (v.28) The Plea for PURITY (look at Christ).
 - b. (v.29) The Plea to PRACTICE (look like Christ)

Since you know the righteousness of Christ (1:5), you can identify those who belong to Him because they walk in the light of Jesus (2:6).

- A. (2:28-3:3) True Fellowship is Characterized by PURITY!
 - 1. (2:28-29) An OVERVIEW of John's teaching.
 - 2. (3:1-3) An OBSERVATION of the truth.
 - a. (v.1) The Wonder of the truth:
 - 1.) See/Behold God's love for His children.
 - 2.) See/Behold how we have become God's family.
 - 3.) See/Behold how God has declared it so.
- 4.) See/Behold how we are rejected / just like Jesus.


Since we freely receive God's heavenly blessings, we should willingly accept the world's rejection.

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 - 1. (2:28-29) An OVERVIEW of John's teaching.
- 2. (3:1-3) An OBSERVATION of the truth.
 - b. (v.2) The Wisdom of the moment.
 - 1.) The Reality: Because of God's love family!
 - 2.) The Rejection: B/c of God's love rejected!
 - 3.) The Revelation: B/c of God's love –

we'll see Him!

- A. (2:28-3:3) True Fellowship is Characterized by PURITY!
 - 1. (2:28-29) An OVERVIEW of John's teaching.
 - 2. (3:1-3) An OBSERVATION of the truth.
 - a. (v.1) The Wonder of the truth.
 - b. (v.2) The Wisdom of the moment.
 - c. (v.3) The Walk while we wait:
 - 1.) Everyone who fixes his hope on Him pure!
 - 2.) We are pure because He is pure (2:1-2)!



A. (2:28-3:3) Fellowship is Characterized by PURITY!

B. (3:4-18) Fellowship Produces Character when PRACTICED!

It is here that John will drive home his point. Since Jesus came in the flesh to pay for the sins of the flesh, and since Jesus died to pay the debt owed by the sinner (so that we might have an eternal relationship with Him) why would those who claim to understand the price of God's great sacrifice, and claim to have accepted God's wondrous grace, want to continue to live a life of sin?

- A. (2:28-3:3) Fellowship is Characterized by <u>PURITY</u>!
- B. (3:4-18) Fellowship Produces Character when PRACTICED!
 - 1. (vs.4-6) Godly Wisdom.
 - a. (v.4) The Principle: The apostate loves sin!
 - b.(v.5) The Point: Jesus came to destroy sin!
 - c. (v.6) The <u>Pronouncement</u>: Those who practice sin don't know Him! (2:6,19)

- B. (3:4-18) Fellowship Produces Character when PRACTICED!
 - 1. (vs.4-6) Godly Wisdom.
 - 2. (vs.7-10) Godly **Warning**:

After driving home the truth that Jesus came to earth to take away sin, John issues a warning.

- a. (v.7a) The <u>Plea</u>: Don't be pulled away by sin. (Matt.5:13-16, John 13:34-35)
- b. (vs.7b-8) The <u>Point</u>: Those who deceive are easily recognized.
- c. (vs.9-10) <u>The Principle</u>: A child looks like his father.

- B. (3:4-18) Fellowship Produces Character when PRACTICED!
 - 1. (vs.4-6) Godly Wisdom.
 - 2. (vs.7-10) Godly Warning.
 - 3. (vs.11-17) Godly Writings:

The believer's character should parallel those who have gone before him (those described in God's Word).

- B. (3:4-18) Fellowship Produces Character when PRACTICED!
 - 3. (vs.11-17) Godly Writings:
 - a. (v.11) The Past <u>Message</u>: Love one another! (Lev. 19:18 / Deut. 6:5f / I Jo. 4:7-8)
 - b. (v.12) The Past <u>Murderer</u>: Lust cause Murder! (Gen.4:8 / His terms not God's)

- 3. (vs.11-17) Godly Writings.
 - c. (vs.13-17) The Conclusion: Abide and Live!
 - 1.) (v.13) Be Clear: The world hates you (3:1).
 - 2.) (v.14-17) Be <u>Cautious</u>: Don't be fooled!
 - a. (vs.14-15) You know the difference between those who love and those who lust!
 - b. (vs.16-17) You know that you have been called to follow Christ's example (offers life) and not the example of Cain (leads to death)!
- 4. (v.18) Godly <u>Wisdom</u>. Do not continue to be immature! (walk in the footsteps of Jesus) (Practice Purity)

James 2:14-19!

What use is it, my brethren, if someone says he has faith but he has no works? Can that faith save him? If a brother or sister is without clothing and in need of daily food and one of you says to them, "Go in peace, be warmed and be filled," and yet you do not give them what is necessary for their body, what use is that? Even so faith, if it has no works, is dead, being by itself. But someone may well say, "You have faith and I have works; show me your faith without the works, and I will show you my faith by my works. You believe that God is one. You do well; the demons also believe and shudder. But are you willing to recognize, you foolish fellow, that faith without works is useless?
